




About the University

GNDU ranked 1st in Punjab and 48th amongst Universities of India in 2019 by NIRF, MHRD, Govt. of India.

Guru Nanak Dev University was established at Amritsar, India on November 24, 1969 to commemorate Guru Nanak Dev's birth quincentenary celebrations. University Grants Commission (UGC) has granted category-1 status to the university, the only university to get this ELITE STATUS in the region of Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh & Chandigarh.

Guru Nanak Dev University has raised its h-index from 62 in 2017 to 145 in 2024 indicating the quality of research publications at national and international level. Department of Education of Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar has organized inauguration of flagship programme of NCTE under NEP-2020 that is Integrated Teacher Education programme (ITEP) viz-to-viz B.Sc. B.Ed., B.Com. B.Ed. and B.A. B.Ed. on October 06, 2023 (Friday) at the conference hall of Guru Granth Sahib Bhawan, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, Under the dynamic and able guidance of Prof (Dr) Jaspal Singh Sandhu, Vice Chancellor, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. Guru Nanak Dev University is the first and only state university in north India to have got approval to launch this program in all the three streams viz-to-viz B.Sc. B.Ed., B.Com. B.Ed. and B.A. B.Ed. for secondary stage with an intake capacity of 50 seats in each course in Department of Education (started for the first time in the country) and this course has been launched in 42 institutions of Central and State Universities of India.

The inauguration programme started with the floral welcome and key concept of ITEP by Prof (Dr) Amit Kauts, Head, Department of Education, Guru Nanak Dev University. Sir introduced the chief guest of the day Prof (Dr) Ved Parkash, Former Chairman, University Grant commission (UGC) and Special Shimla, Prof (Dr) Former director, Guest Interpretation division, Lok Sabha, New Delhi and former Registrar, JC Bose University of Science and Technology, Faridabad, with the students and faculty of the Department of Education. This course will prepare teachers for the 4 stages of the new school structure i.e. Foundational, Preparatory, Middle and Secondary (5+3+3+4). ITEP will be available for all students who choose teaching as a profession after Secondary education, by choice.

He said that ITEP is a 4 Year dual-major undergraduate degree offering B.A. B.Ed. and B.Sc. B.Ed. and B.Com. B.Ed. Admission to the course has been carried out by the National Testing Agency (NTA) through the National Common Entrance Test (NCET).

This integrated course will benefit students since they will save one year by finishing the course in 4 years rather than the customary 5 years required by the present B.Ed. plan,". "ITEP will not only impart cutting-edge pedagogy but will also establish a foundation in childhood education care and (ECCE), foundational literacy and numeracy (FLN), inclusive education and an understanding of India values/ethos/art/traditions, its among others.

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar is among 42 institutions of India to offer a four-year integrated programme in teacher education aligned with National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The National Council of Teacher Education (NCTE), New Delhi has granted recognition to 42 Central and State universities and institutions, including IITs, NITs, RIEs, and IGNOU, for the first phase piloting of Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) as envisioned in NEP 2020. By 2030, according to the NEP 2020. educationally only multidisciplinary and four-year integrated teacher education programmes shall be in force. ITEP curriculum framework draft has been prepared in consonance with the NEP 2020 and the schemes. syllabi and ordinances of the programme have approved by the University's Academic been Council.

Prof (Dr) Ved Parkash, Former Chairman, University Grant commission (UGC) shared that the conceptualisation of teacher education programmes (TEPs) has begun at 1) pre-primary to primary, and 2) upper primary to secondary. The programme was conceptualised to integrate liberal UG studies with professional preparation of teachers learning from the experiences of the existing four-year programme models.
